### DCU Memorial Scholarship

Students in their senior year of high school who plan to attend a state or nationally accredited college or university this fall can apply for the Annual Memorial Scholarship Program.

### Tau Beta Beta, Inc. Scholarship

Tau Beta Beta, Inc. is dedicated to providing scholarships to young women who are residents of Brookline, Newton, or Wellesley. Scholarships are awarded to four or five new applicants per year, and support normally continues through four years of college. Scholarships in excess of \$60,000 in total are divided among 15+ women. Scholarships are based on merit and financial need.

### The National Catholic College Admission Association Scholarship

The National CCAA is a non-profit organization of nearly 130 Catholic colleges and universities committed to promoting the value of Catholic higher education and serving students in the transition to college. The National CCAA will award 8 one-time \$1,000 scholarships to high school seniors graduating in Spring 2019 who will be attending one of the National CCAA member institutions as a first-year student in Fall 2019. Students who opt to defer their first year of college (to enter in Fall 2020) are not eligible for the scholarship.

### **Natick MathWorks Scholarship**

The Town of Natick will award two \$10,000 scholarships to high school seniors that have strong academic records in math and science. To be eligible for the scholarship, students must commit to pursuing a degree in mathematics, engineering, science or related program at an accredited four-year college or university. Students attending public, private, non-profit and parochial schools are eligible to apply. The program is open to all high school seniors in Natick. Each scholarship is structured as a four-year award, with the first year being \$1,000, the second year \$2,000, the third year \$3,000 and the fourth year \$4,000. Ongoing eligibility requirements must be met to receive the award in the second through fourth years.

### **Greater Boston Real Estate Board Scholarship**

The Greater Boston Real Estate Board Scholarship has been established to provide scholarships ranging from \$500 to \$5,000 to graduating high school seniors who reside in Boston or the Greater Boston area. Applicants will be evaluated on the following criteria: Demonstrated Academic Achievement, Leadership Experience and Extra-Curricular Involvement, Demonstrated Financial Need, Short Answer Response, and Essay Response.

### **New England Association for College Admission Counseling (NEACAC) Essay Contest** (Open to juniors and seniors)

There will be six winners – one from each of the New England States – who will each be awarded a \$1000 Scholarship.
